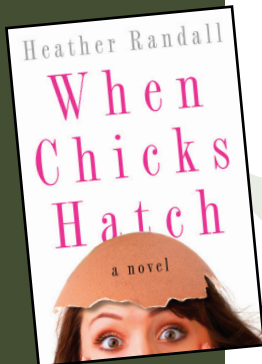
Brief Author Bio

New Novel Emphasizes the Fragility of Life and the Value of Brokenness

Enumclaw, WA—Novelist Heather Randall reveals Christian characters with flaws, moments of despair, and weakness—but that’s what makes her characters strong, she says.

Randall’s book, *When Chicks Hatch* (WinePress, 2010), shares the lives of five women, the value of brokenness, and their journey towards healing.

“I am really proud of how the Christians are portrayed. They are loving and imperfect, not pious. They display God in their decisions and the quiet actions of their life. I think everyone can relate to the powerless feeling that the characters all share. We want to be able to fix our own messes and make things right on our own, but God is the one who works things together for our good, not us.”
